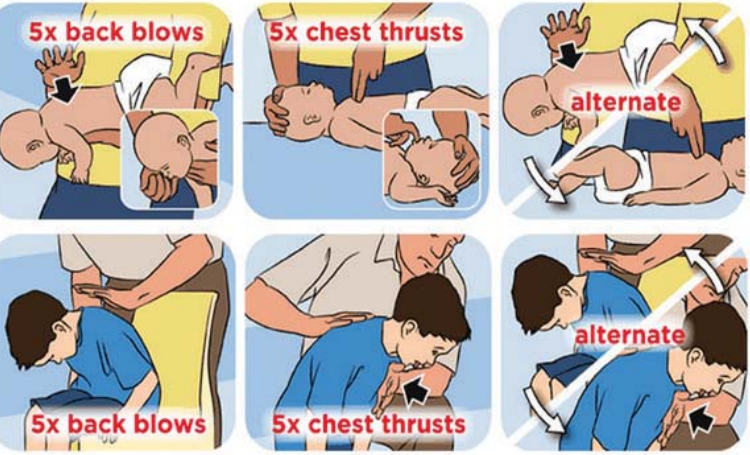


WHAT DO YOU DO WHEN YOUR CHILD IS CHOKING?

Rustenburg – It's common for toddlers to put items and food in their mouth and choke. "In fact, choking is a leading cause of accidental death for children younger than 14," says Weyland Bothma, Trauma Rescue's station manager. Children can lose consciousness quickly, so it's important to know how to effectively clear the airway through performing the Finger sweep, Back slaps, Chest thrust or Heimlich manoeuvre. If this fails to dislodge the item obstructing the airway,
