

# Country night at Bosveld Oord



**Rustenburg** – Rustenburg's own Andries Scheepers has been selected to represent South Africa at the 2017 UCI Para Cycling Road World Championships in Pietermaritzburg later this year.

The world championships will be held from 31 August to 03 September 2017. The event in 2017 will consist of two days of time-trial competitions and road racing competitions.

The time trial will be staged in and around one of the key landmarks of the region at Midmar Dam and the two days of road races will take place in Pietermaritzburg itself, using the Alexander Park as the central event headquarters.


# Songbird Lira captivates!

**Rustenburg/ Phokeng** – There was one place to be on Saturday night, 27 May 2017, and that was at the Lebone II – College of the Royal Ba-fokeng amphitheatre in Phokeng. Award-winning South African Songstress Lira performed live to a sell-out crowd of 1600 people, despite the South African Music Awards happening at Sun City just kilometres away.

The concert took place in the magnificent amphitheatre at Lebone II College, which last year also hosted Johnny Clegg Unplugged with great success. The school's "Lebone Live" programme aims to bring annual superstar concerts to the school in the village of Phokeng, for the Ba-fokeng and the greater North West community to enjoy.

On the night Lira was captivating, singing her well-known songs such as *Let there be light*, *Feel good* and *Hamba*. There were two numbers sung with the Lebone II College Choir, the first of which was Labi Siffre's *Something inside* so strong. The result of this collaboration was a powerful and moving performance, for which she credited the amazing choir. In the second song *Believer* she extended the performance to take the choir and the concertgoers through a number of dance moves, even inviting of the choir members to the front of the stage to dance with her. As part of Lebone Live, former Idols musician and finalist, Siphelele Fuzé also performed as the supporting act.

Lebone II College raised over R200 000 in funds by hosting this concert, which will be added to the Lebone II Scholarship Programme. This programme currently serves 45% of the student body through a range of bursaries and scholarships.

## Scheffer and Mudzinganyama, victors at FNB Platinum Trail Run

**Buffelspoort** – The ATKV in Buffelspoort was a hub of excitement on Sunday, 4 June 2017, when close to 1000 eager trail runners gathered to experience some of the best trail run routes on offer in the Magaliesberg at the much anticipated FNB Platinum Trail Run.

Spoil for choice, trail runners could choose between three magnificent routes: a challenging 24km race, a shorter challenge of 12km and a less challenging 8km route.

Reigning 24km men's champion, Givemore Mudzinganyama, obliterated the field in a lightning fast time of 01 hour 29 minutes 20 seconds. "I felt really good today," said Mudzinganyama.

Tranquil Gumbo came in second, while Ngwenu Mzimazte finished third.

Rustenburg's own Leilani Scheffer claimed gold in the women's 24km race in an impressive time of 01 hour 49 minutes 47 seconds. "I forgot how tough this route is," said a very relieved Scheffer. Adronica Mokgota came in second, while Magretha Wang finished third.

"We would like to congratulate all the participants who took part in this year's stimulating competition. The route was filled with breath-taking sceneries that inspired athletes from different backgrounds to keep moving until the finish line," Mike Vacy-Lyle, CEO FNB Business, said.
