BE ALERT, BE SAFE!

Rustenburg – After the recent spike in crime in and around Rustenburg, *Platinum Weekly* spoke to Wesalarms operational manager Pierre Cronje about enhancing safety. "We have recently experienced an increase in house break-ins. Thieves force open windows and doors to gain access to homes and rob residents of their valuables. In some cases, they enter homes while the people are at home." According to Pierre, vigilance is the key to safety.

"Be aware of your surroundings. If you see

anything suspect, report it. Your first line of defence should be an electric fence, second is having alarm beams around your property, to alert you before the perpetrators enter your home. Keep windows closed. It is easier to gain access through an open window, even with burglar bars. The most important thing to remember: if intruders enter your property, DO NOT go outside or confront them. Stay in your area of safety in order to avoid being overpowered."

He also advised that you should test your alarm

system at least twice a month. Remember to phone your security company and inform them that you are testing your alarm – do the same when you accidentally trigger the alarm. He added: "When we have to respond to false alarms, it takes up manpower that could have been spent on actual emergencies." If you ever find yourself in a life-threatening situation, you can contact Wesalarms even if you are not a client. **CARJACKINGS ON THE INCREASE IN NORTH WEST**

North West Province – Police urge motorists to be cautious when travelling or stopping alongside roads, following several carjacking incidents recently reported at various clusters within the North West Province.

In some instances, unsuspecting motorists were stopped and robbed of their valuables and vehicles, hijacked by people who pretended to be traffic or police officials.

In an incident close to Sun City in August, a 29-year old victim was stopped by two men travelling in a Ford Bantam bakkie, pretending to be lost. They pointed a firearm at the man and demanded his car keys. The suspects then drove off with his silver Nissan Navara.

In another incident in August, a 27-year old motorist was travelling between Lethlabile and Brits when she stopped to change a flat tyre. An unidentified vehicle parked next to her and she was offered help by two men. After changing the tyre, the men assaulted her, took her personal belongings – including her cell phone – and drove off in her Volkswagen Polo.

On Thursday, 5 September, a 46-year old man was held at gunpoint and his Volkswagen Amarok hijacked on the Derby-Rustenburg road. It is alleged that he stopped next to the road when two suspects who pretended to ask for directions approached him. The suspects assaulted the man, forced him into the back of his vehicle and kidnapped him. The victim was allegedly dropped off near Randfontein by the suspects who fled in his vehicle. Police spokesperson captain Sam Tselanyane request

motorists to be vigilant and to report suspicious persons or vehicles at their nearest police stations.

SAFETY TIPS AS A PRECAUTIONARY MEASURE

- Never pick up or offer a lift to hitchhikers or strangers.
- Avoid stopping next to the road, except for an emergency.
- A well-maintained car is less likely to break down and leave you vulnerable. Check your tyres regularly.
- Plan your route and let someone know what route you are taking, and when to expect you at your destination.
- Always check the rear-view mirror to see if you are being followed.
- Avoid distractions while driving such as using a cell phone.
- If you suspect that you are being followed, drive to the nearest police station or a busy public area.
- When approaching a red traffic light, slow down so that you only reach it when it turns green – especially during the night (try to always have your car moving and not stationary).
- If possible, park in a central, well-lit place, preferably with guards on duty.
- When stopping behind another vehicle, leave half a vehicle length in front so you can make an emergency escape if necessary.
- Avoid driving through unfamiliar areas and late at night or during the early hours of the morning when the roads are quiet.
- If possible, never drive alone.
- Never follow routine routes when driving, change routes on a regular basis.

• If possible, avoid driving in the dark. Hijackers may stage a minor accident for example if your vehicle is bumped from behind and you do not feel comfortable with the individual involved in the situation, indicate that he or she must follow you and drive to the nearest police station or busy public area for help.
