Rustenburg – Staan Saam Rustenburg Community Watch started as a normal neighbourhood watch.

After the strikes in 2012, the need for the community to stand together was greater than ever before. From there, Staan Saam Rustenburg grew to what it is known as today.

SSR focuses on their immediate environment, Rustenburg. They aid families in the form of food and clothing. The organisation currently cares for about 3,000 people with food parcels and clothes on a monthly basis.

The famous Staan Saam Huis is never quiet and there is a constant flow of people in need of help. SSR relies solely on donations, items that cannot be given to the those in need are sold to make money to pay the rent for the Staan Saam Huis or to buy more food. Watch founder Naomi Kleinschmidt Pasino said: "We saw the need in the community, and we knew we had to do something. We see so many challenges every day but by the grace of God and the help of the community, we can face them head on. I have shed so many tears for the people we help, and I always wish there were more that we could do. We need to stand together in this fight to make the world and Rustenburg a better place and that is what Staan Saam is all about."



BE WATER WISE

SA – Clean fresh water is a limited resource. With the severe droughts taking place globally, this valuable commodity is becoming scarce. Although 70% of earth is covered in water, 97% of all water on earth is saltwater – which is not suitable for drinking.

Only 3% of water on Earth is fresh water of which 2.5% of that fresh water is locked in ice caps, glaciers, the atmosphere, soil, or under the earth's surface - which means that only 0.5% of all water on earth is available for drinking.

HERE ARE A FEW TIPS TO SAVE WATER

- Check taps and pipes for leaks. A leaky pipe is just an annoyance, but also a significant waste of water.
- Fill a jug or bottle with drinking water and keep it in the fridge, rather than opening a tap.
- When showering, collect the running water while you wait for it to warm up and use this water for your garden.
- It is vital that you know where the master tap of your house is located. In the event of a burst pipe, you can save water by turning off the master tap, thereby preventing wastage and further damage to the pipe.
- Check your toilet for leaks.
- Water your garden after sunset. Watering

your garden in the early morning or late evening allows the grass and plants to soak up water without being evaporated by the sun.

- Save water, money and energy by only boiling as many cups of water as you need.
- If the ice in your drink has melted or you have water left in the pot from making some pasta, you can use this to water your plants.
- If you're all thumbs and none of them are green... why not plant a succulent or cactus garden? Cacti and other succulents require minimal attention, effort and water.
