EDUCATORS MAKE ZINNIAVILLE SECONDARY SCHOOL PROUD

Zinniaville - The National Teacher's Awards (NTA) and Zinniaville Secondary School have become synonymous.

Yet again, their educators have displayed their true potential as well as expressed how passionate they are of the teaching profession.

On Saturday 15 February, two of their educators; Mr Sahaboodin Abdull and Mrs Ayesha Ismail attended the NTA as finalists in their respective categories at Soshangwe High School in Pretoria. Abdull, the school's recently retired principal, entered the Excellence in Secondary School Leadership category and was aptly placed in this category as he is a true leader.

His passion has been rewarded time and again during previous NTA's where he won three national winners as well as three-second place runner-ups all from the school.

The special assembly was attended by members of the victors' families, friends, departmental officials, colleagues and community members.

Both Abdull and Ismail were praised for their achievements.

Rustenburg - From a very young age, Mogomotsi Maphuta knew that he wanted to pursue his passion for dancing.

He started the company Youth in Motion to teach Dancesport in his community and then he reached out to local schools in Rustenburg.

Youth In Motion Dance Studio started with just six learners and now has over 30 dancers.

His learners are now actively participating in dancing as a sport. "Not everyone is good at contact sports, but they still want to be active. It allows learners to be part of a team environment, participate competitively and teaches them the same discipline and structure of other sports. It allows mass participation, development and growth for the youth," said Maphuta.

In an interview with *Platinum Weekly*, Sacred Hearts Private Primary School principal Michael Atuherwe said he could see the positive impact the sport has had on the learners who pursued it.

"They have more self-confidence and you can see that they are truly enjoying themselves," he said.

Through the programme, young aspiring dancers are taught a variety of genres that include hip hop, jive and even ballroom dancing.

Maphuta hopes to extend the programme to more schools. "We have something for everyone, and we would like to raise more awareness for the sport," he added.

The youth are also inspired to pursue a career in dancing and can train to become a choreographer, coach, judge, examiner, scrutineer, educator, skills development dancer and lots more. This in return tackles tough social and environmental problems. Although there are still many challenges the company faces,

they have already won many awards. Last year they won third place in the 2019 North West Sports Awards' school team of the year category and Maphuta is determined to keep on reaching for the sky. "Our dream is to have a learner in the Olympic Games one day".
