Fostering sustainable growth in Bethanie where the previously inadequate healthcare service delivery negatively impacted the people, Glencore Alloys South Africa (Glencore) handed over a state-of-the art healthcare facility to the Department of Health on Wednesday 22 July.

The Bethanie Clinic, near Brits was constructed at a cost of R30 million. MEC of Health Madoda Sambatha attended the handover and addressed the community who gathered to celebrate the occasion. The significance of this investment into the community was all the more poignant while being faced with the COVID-19 pandemic. The old Bethanie Clinic had become rundown and ill-equipped to treat the more than 3,500 people who were visiting on a monthly basis from nearby villages of this remote part of the North West province. To respond to this challenge, Glencore built the all new Bethanie Clinic right across the road from the old one. The clinic now serves a broader community of more than 27,000 people. The facility consists of a patient registration area, a waiting room, an admission room, two observation rooms, an emergency room, four consultation rooms, TB rooms, dentist’s rooms, a pharmacy, a staff kitchen, a green room, ablution facilities, a boardroom, a data server room and a patient record room. It also boasts a

brand-new neo-natal ward, complete with two delivery rooms, a four-bed ante-natal room and a six-bed post-natal room, which has a baby booth and two bathrooms with showers. Furthermore, the clinic is equipped with a 21,000-litre water reservoir and an emergency generator with a diesel capacity of 2,000 litres.

With Woman’s Day just around the corner, they would like to take the opportunity to educate women about the different types of violence that exist and remind them that there is no excuse for abuse. Too many women have fallen prey to intimate partner violence (IPV) and for this reason, it is important to look out for the signs.

IPV is abuse or aggression that occurs in a close relationship. ‘Intimate partner’ refers to both current and former spouses and dating partners. IPV can vary in how often it happens and how severe it is. It can range from one episode of violence

to chronic and severe episodes over several years – all of which could have a lasting negative impact on the victim.

**IPV includes these types of behaviour:**

- Using physical aggression.
- Regular jealous, suspicious, and/or angry behaviour from partners – even if they have no reason to be.
- A person controlling their partner’s time.
- A person controlling their partner’s money.
- Using verbal threats.
- Isolating their partner.
