CABLE THIEVES Caught Red-Handed

Platinum Weekly newspaper | Rustenburg – Just days after Platinum Weekly highlighted the growing wave of infrastructure vandalism plunging parts of the city into darkness, four suspects were arrested while allegedly attempting to steal copper cables along the R24 on Monday, 4 May 2026. The suspects were apprehended by White Leopard Security while reportedly digging and tampering with critical municipal infrastructure. According to the office of the executive mayor at the Rustenburg Local Municipality, the group consists of two individuals from Mozambique and two from Zimbabwe.

The arrest follows closely on last week's incident at the Donkerhoek Substation, where a transformer was stripped of copper – leaving communities without electricity and once again exposing the vulnerability of essential infrastructure. These incidents are becoming part of a worrying pattern. Substations, cables, and key components are increasingly being targeted, with devastating consequences. Cable theft is not a minor offence. It disrupts livelihoods, halts business operations, and deepens the strain on an already fragile system. In a city where electricity is essential for survival, every act of theft carries a real and immediate cost.

The Department of Home Affairs has opened a Section 212 docket, with further immigration processes, including possible deportation, to follow pending the outcome of court proceedings. The Rustenburg Local Municipality has strongly condemned the incident and reiterated its call for community vigilance.

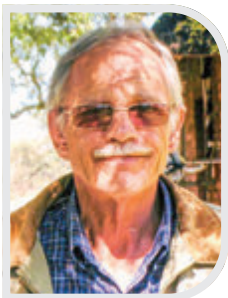

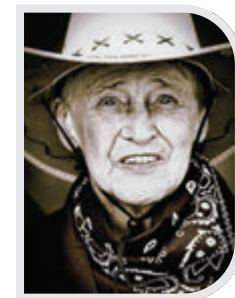

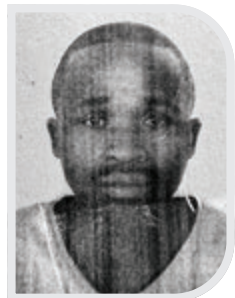

Road sinkhole forces closure between Kwa Maritane and Mogwase



Early signs of a developing sinkhole on the R556 between Kwa Maritane and Mogwase, prompting an immediate road closure to protect motorists.

Platinum Weekly newspaper | Mogwase – Motorists travelling between Kwa Maritane and Mogwase are urged to take note of a temporary road closure following the discovery of a developing sinkhole on the R556.

The Moses Kotane Local Municipality, in collaboration with Public Safety and Provincial Traffic authorities, confirmed on 6 May 2026 that the affected section of the road has been closed to all traffic as a precautionary safety measure. According to officials, the sinkhole poses a serious risk, with concerns that the road surface could deteriorate further and potentially collapse if left unmanaged. Authorities have acted swiftly to prevent possible accidents or injuries. Motorists are strongly advised to make use of alternative routes, with the R510 currently recommended until further notice. Traffic officials are expected to monitor the situation closely while assessments are conducted and repair plans are put in place.

When the Law Breakers Wear the Badge...

Platinum Weekly newspaper | Rustenburg – Two Marikana police officers have appeared before the Rustenburg Magistrates' Court on serious charges that strike at the heart of public trust in law enforcement.

Warrant officer Make Johannes Nkgweng (47) and sergeant Lebogang Antoinette Itumeleng (47), both attached to Marikana Visible Policing, were each granted bail of R2,000 on Tuesday, 28 April 2026. They are expected to return to court on Friday, 22 May 2026, facing charges of defeating the ends of justice and aiding an escape.

According to colonel Adèle Myburgh, the pair were arrested on the same day by members of the Provincial Anti-Corruption Investigation Unit (ACIU).

The incident dates back to Tuesday, 3 December 2024, when the officers transported detainees from Marikana Police Station to the Rustenburg Magistrates' Court. One of the suspects, held for contravening immigration laws, was denied bail and was meant to be returned to the police station. However, the suspect was never brought back into custody, prompting an investigation by the ACIU. The acting provincial police commissioner of North West, major general (Dr) Ryno Naidoo, commended the ACIU for uncovering the matter, but strongly condemned the alleged actions of the officers.

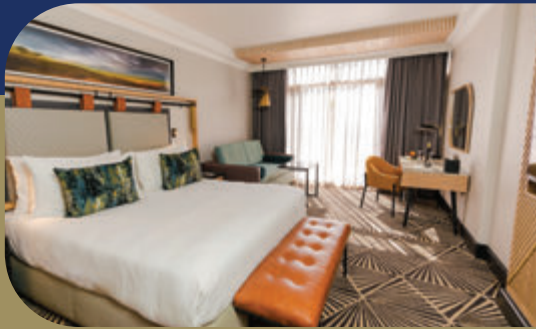

R3,6 MILLION FRAUD CASE ROCKS LOCAL INSURANCE SECTOR

Platinum Weekly newspaper | Rustenburg – A 32-year-old woman has appeared in court in connection with a multi-million rand fraud case. Neo Moalusi appeared before the Specialised Commercial Crime Court in Rustenburg on Tuesday, 28 April 2026, facing six counts of fraud linked to the alleged theft of more than R3,6 million from her former employer. According

to lieutenant colonel Tinyiko Mathebuta, the case stems from an investigation by the Hawks' Serious Commercial Crime Investigation unit. Moalusi was served with a summons on 15 April 2026. It is alleged that between 2023 and 2024, while employed at a Rustenburg-based life insurance company, Moalusi created fictitious insurance policy clients using the personal details of unsuspecting individuals. These fraudulent policies reportedly resulted in an actual financial loss exceeding R3,6 million for the company. Further investigations revealed that Moalusi allegedly acted in collaboration with seven other individuals in carrying out the scheme. Authorities have already served summons on two of the additional suspects, who appeared in court on 6 May 2026. Moalusi was released on a warning and was also scheduled to reappear before the same court on 6 May 2026 as investigations continue.

HEAD-ON HORROR ON R24

Platinum Weekly newspaper | Rustenburg – A tragic head-on collision on the R24 at Olifantsnek, just before entering Rustenburg, has claimed the life of one person and left another critically injured. The incident occurred at approximately 15:56 on Tuesday, 5 May 2026, when a light motor vehicle and a truck collided head-on. Emergency services were immediately dispatched following reports that two occupants were trapped inside the vehicle. Upon arrival, responders found that the driver of the light motor vehicle had sadly already succumbed to injuries sustained in the impact. “The second occupant was found alive but critically injured and severely entrapped,” said Hennie Madeley, Eagle Trauma Rescue’s operational manager. Teams from Rustenburg First Responders, alongside Eagle Trauma Rescue, EMS personnel and Rustenburg Fire and Rescue Services, worked with urgency to stabilise the injured patient while fire crews carried out the delicate extrication process. Through coordinated efforts, the patient was successfully freed from the wreckage, stabilised on scene, and transported to Medicare Hospital for further medical treatment. Additional support was provided by Lenco, assisting in ensuring the patient received urgent care. Ammaar Wadee, Rustenburg First Responders administrator, said: “We offer our sincere and heartfelt condolences to the family and loved ones of the deceased, and keep them in our thoughts during this time of grief.”

EVICTED... BUT NOT GONE: occupants return to park

Platinum Weekly newspaper | Rustenburg – An intervention to remove informal occupants from Paul Bodenstein Park is underway as part of the Rustenburg Local Municipality’s *City at Work Programme* – but a recent visit shows the situation remains complex on the ground. The municipality confirmed that informal occupants were removed from the park on Thursday, 30 April 2026, following growing concerns around environmental damage, public health risks, safety threats, and the obstruction of a public recreational space meant for the community. According to the municipality, the process was carried out lawfully and in a coordinated manner, with prior notices issued and due consideration given to human dignity and applicable legal frameworks. The initiative forms part of broader efforts to restore public spaces, improve safety, and ensure facilities are used as intended. However, when *Platinum Weekly* visited the park on 6 May 2026, signs of ongoing occupation were still visible. While one of the public toilet structures had been cleared, other facilities were still being used as makeshift shelters. In some cases, materials used by informal occupants to create temporary roofing structures had been set alight after removal. This was reportedly done to prevent the same materials from being reused and to discourage reoccupation of the buildings. The municipality indicated that it is working with relevant stakeholders and social support structures to explore appropriate solutions for displaced individuals, in line with government’s broader social development commitments. Residents are urged to remain vigilant and report illegal activities, vandalism, or unlawful occupation, as the success of such interventions depends not only on enforcement but also on community cooperation. As the clean-up continues, the situation at Paul Bodenstein Park highlights a broader and ongoing challenge — balancing the protection of public spaces with the realities of displacement and human need.

FROM RUBBLE TO RESULTS

Our Ward Matters turns community care into action

Platinum Weekly newspaper | Rustenburg – From teaching young minds to transforming neighbourhood streets, *Our Ward Matters (OWM)* continues to turn action into visible change across Wards 15, 16 and 17. Led by founder André van Dyk, alongside Ward 17 councillor Tanya Rothman and supported by Cllr Jean Keyser, the initiative proves that consistency, teamwork and community pride can restore both environment and safety.

Wednesday, 29 April
The day began early, with teams spreading across Geelhoutpark and Ward 15. Members cleared litter, cut overgrown grass, and opened up neglected spaces from Manuka to Geelhoutpark SPAR, through Pendoring and Cycad, all the way to Kremetart Avenue and surrounding areas. At the same time, another team focused on Kremetart Avenue towards Kruisbessie and Waterbessie, tackling dense veld and waste accumulation. These clean-ups are not only about appearance — they directly impact safety, especially

in areas where overgrowth and reeds have become hiding spots linked to house break-ins and other criminal activity.

Thursday, 30 April
Months of consistent effort began to show real results. Areas near Rustenburg Baptist Church at Wildevy and Kruger Street, once overwhelmed by illegal dumping, squatters, and substance abuse activity, have been significantly cleared and opened.

Through ongoing engagement with Public Safety and the Rustenburg Local Municipality, as well as awareness campaigns and community mobilisation, OWM has managed to push back against what once felt like a losing battle. GrowthPoint Church joined hands through the Let’s Help project, reinforcing the power of unity. Positive change is already visible — Lepelhout Avenue has been restored, illegal structures removed, and both sides of Kruger Bridge cleared, improving visibility and safety for residents and commuters alike.

Monday, 4 May
The clean-up moved to Pendoring and Seringa Avenue — and what the team found highlighted the ongoing challenge. Dumped couches, nappies, alcohol bottles, garden refuse, and general waste had once again accumulated.

OWM is urging residents to stop illegal dumping, particularly garden refuse, which creates hiding places for criminals, attracts pests, and increases fire risks during dry seasons. These affected areas impact both Protea Park and Geelhoutpark, with continued concerns around illegal occupation and safety. While progress has been made, the work is far from over. The team still requires essential support, including petrol,

refuse bags, pangas, and skips to remove large volumes of waste and debris.

A COMMUNITY EFFORT WORTH CELEBRATING

OWM emphasised that none of this work happens in isolation. The initiative extended heartfelt thanks to the businesses and individuals who continue to stand behind them. Wildevy Laundry4U & Water4U were recognised for consistently sponsoring water for clean-up days and even treating the team to pancakes — small gestures that make long days in the field more manageable. Paint Palette contributed refuse bags critical for large-scale clean-ups, while Marilize De Beer and other residents responded quickly to calls for assistance. Additional support from Wildevy Centrum, Protea Park Engen, Wouter, and ongoing community donors has helped sustain momentum and ensure that clean-ups can continue week after week.

Beyond physical clean-ups, OWM continues to encourage residents to report illegal activities, including dumping, public drinking, squatting, and crime. Awareness, accountability, and community involvement remain key to long-term change.
